



Succeeding with MIPS and the Quality Payment Program

What is MIPS?

Medicare's newest program, the Merit-Based Incentive Payment System (MIPS), begins January 1, 2017, and combines PQRS, Value Modifier, and Meaningful Use into a single program.

What am I scored on under MIPS?

In 2017, the points you receive in three weighted performance categories comprise your Final Score, which is compared to the threshold score set by CMS.

What's at stake?

In the first year of MIPS, providers have the potential to gain or lose up to 4% of their Medicare payment. In 2017, the transition year for MIPS, it's easy to participate and avoid a penalty.

Does MIPS apply to me?


MIPS applies to you in the first year if you are a MD, DO, DMD, DDS, DPM, PA, NP, CRNA, CNS, DC, OD.

Exempt in Year 1:

- ✓ Qualifying participant in an advanced APM
- ✓ First year provider in Medicare Part B PFS
- ✓ Treat ≤100 Medicare patients or have ≤\$30,000 in Medicare Part B charges
- Part of a hospital or facility (ambulatory surgery center, independent testing lab, etc.)
