Colorectal cancer includes cancer that begins in the large intestine (colon cancer) and the rectum (rectal cancer)

In Illinois in 2015:

Black residents were nearly twice as likely 1.6 times to die from colorectal cancer than white residents


of Black colorectal


Up-to-Date Colorectal Cancer Screening, 2016*






Hispanic and Black residents of Illinois are less likely to be up-todate with their colorectal cancer screening tests


