HPV is more common than you may think. About 79 million people in the United States are infected with HPV.



About 7 million new cases of HPV occur every year in the United States in people ages 15 to 24.



HPV often has no signs or symptoms. People can have the virus, pass it on, and not even know it.



HPV can affect both men and women. HPV can lead to certain cancers in men and women.



The CDC recommends catch-up vaccination for adults through age 26 who have not been vaccinated before, or who have not completed the vaccination series.
