Fast Facts

49.6% of adults aged 20 and over have high blood pressure and/or are taking antihypertensive medication.

Approximately 60% of Americans aged 60 and over have hypertension. ²


Hypertension affects 1 in 4 adults! African Americans are at an increased risk of developing hypertension at a younger age and more frequently.³

In 2017, there were 32.8 million visits to physician offices where the patient's primary diagnosis was hypertension. 4


Heart disease and stroke are the first and third leading causes of death and a major cause of disability in Illinois!⁵

One person in the USA dies every 36 seconds from heart disease.⁶

48% of all adults in the USA have some form of cardiovascular disease. 6

ACTION PLAN

Hypertension risk factors include age, race, family history, being overweight/obese, having a sedentary lifestyle, tobacco & alcohol use, a poor diet, and stress.
