Conveying Family Medicine's Impact

- About 7% of the population received care in a hospital compared to roughly 60% of the population who received care from a family physician.
- As constituents, family physicians need to address this discrepancy with their elected officials.

Scope of Legislative Advocacy

Government relations advocacy at the Illinois state capitol building for the Illinois Academy of Family Physicians requires vigilant tracking of legislation and regulatory activity on a variety of policy areas, including but not limited to:

- Scope of Practice
- Telehealth Services
- Medicare & Medicaid
- Preventive Care & Medical Screenings
- Controlled Substances & Opioids
- Immunizations & Vaccines
- Workforce Development
- Public Health
- Rural Health
- Tobacco

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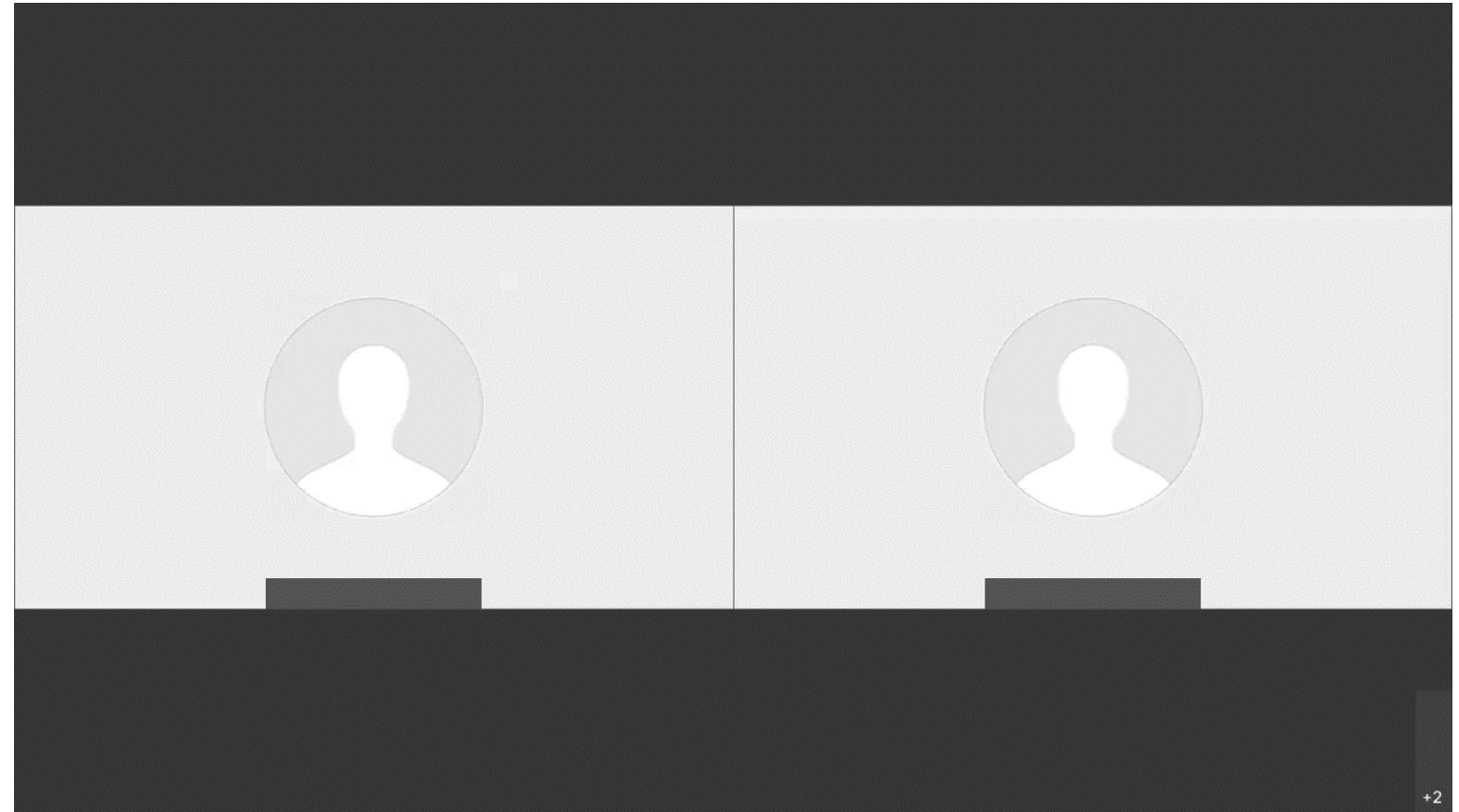

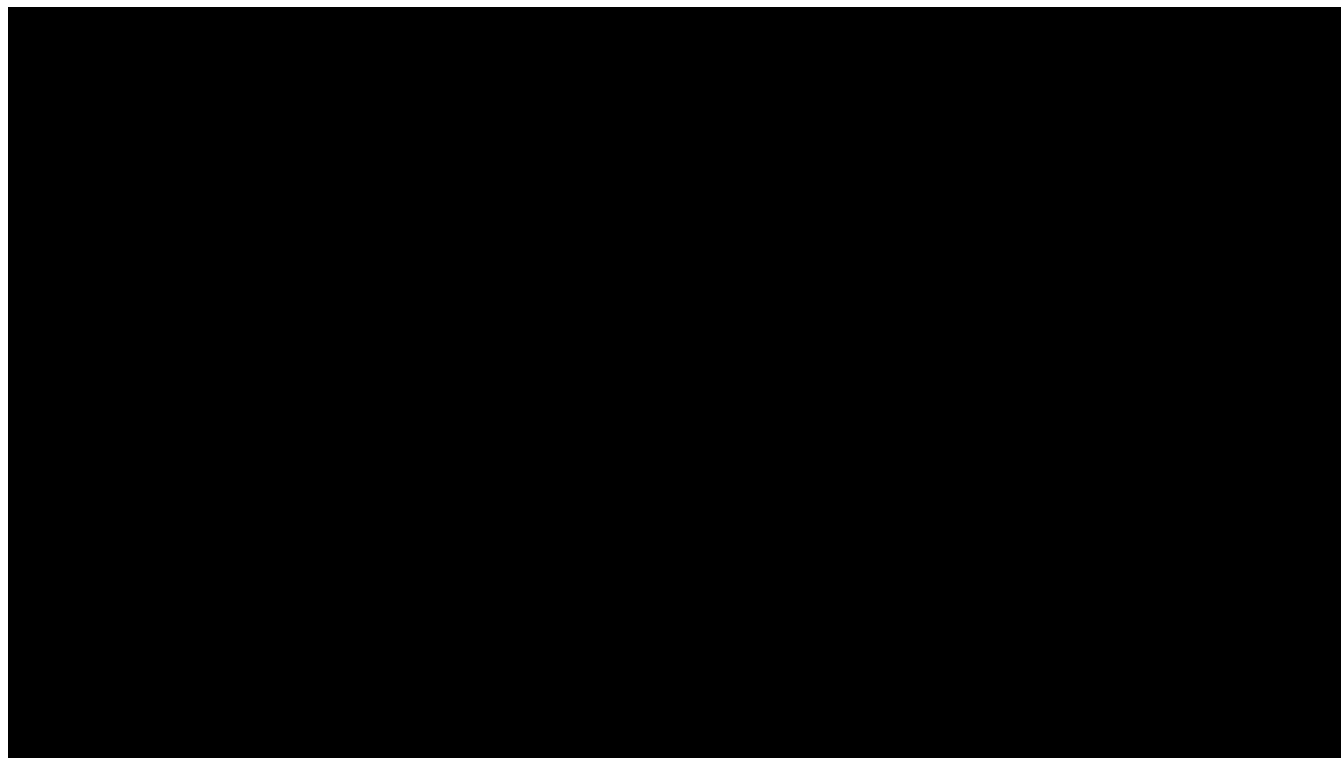
WHAT IS IT?	HOW DOES IT WORK?	WHY SHOULD I JOIN?

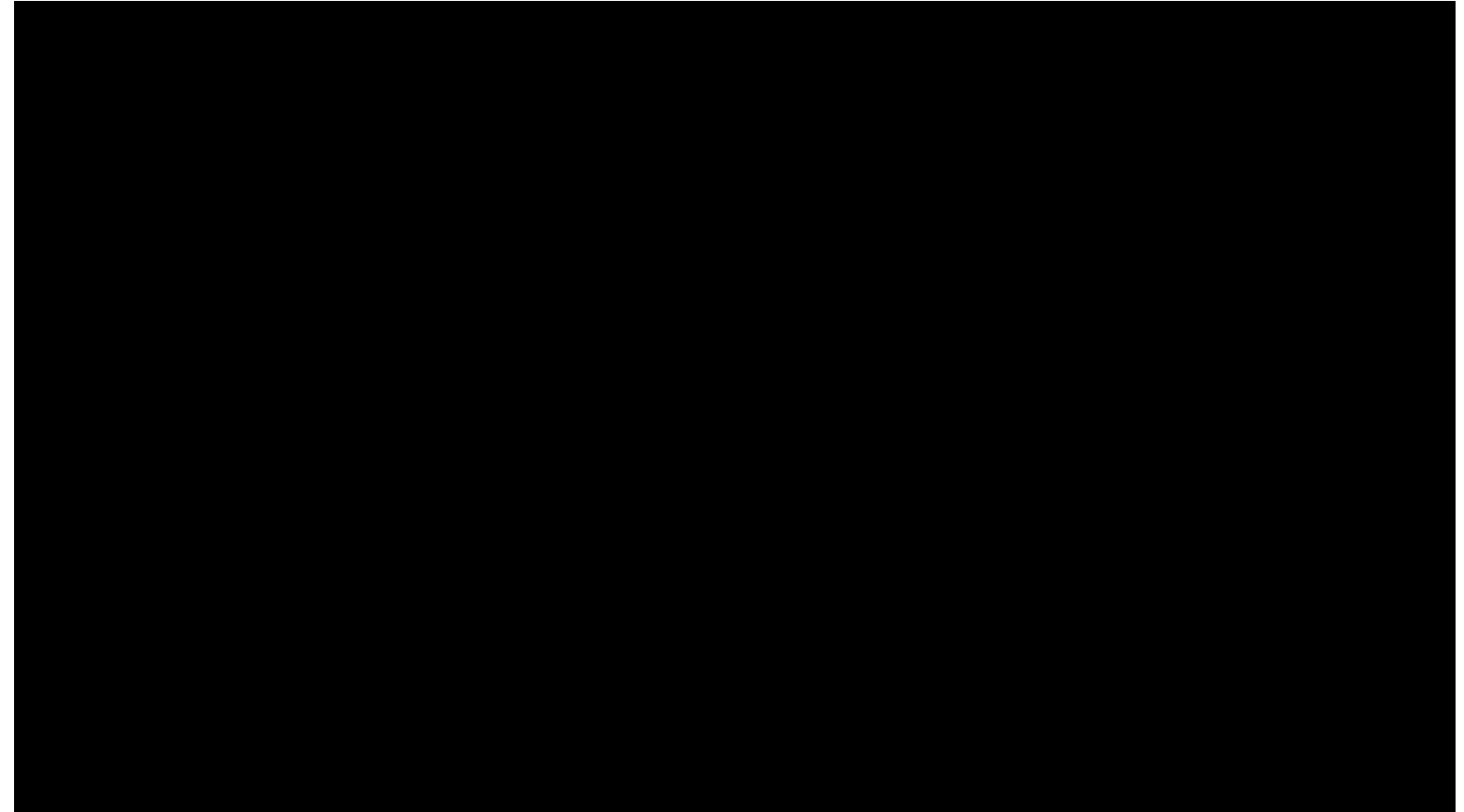
