




Do's and Don'ts of Lobbying

- Eliminate background distractions
- Prepare a checklist of talking points
- ✓ If you don't know the answer, it is OK to follow up
- Be professional, courteous, direct, clear, concise, factual, credible and specific
- Stay positive, be a good listener
- When presenting an argument, try to take a local angle and use both facts and anecdotes
- Thank the MOC and/or staff for meeting with you
- Treat MOC and their staff as friends and intelligent persons
- Leave time for questions



Do's and Don'ts of Lobbying



- Don't exaggerate, lie, or provide false or misleading information
- Don't become distracted and talk about unrelated events



- Don't interrupt
- Don't become defensive or confrontational
- Don't complain about your elected officials
- Don't make partisan comments
- Don't talk about campaign contributions or fundraising activity
