Here are some inspiring examples of our family physicians, your constituents, sharing their expertise in forums across Illinois:



**Springfield:** Sara Malone, MD and the SIU Centers for Family Medicine, were featured in <u>Randolph County Herald Tribune</u> for expanding access to COVID-19 testing for Illinoisans in Carbondale, Quincy and Springfield.

**Peoria:** Hayley Ralph, MD is on maternity leave and provided guidance in <u>Peoria Herald & Review article</u> on how to care for yourself at home if you get sick – in communication with your primary doctor.

**Chicago:** Kevin Most, DO, used his regular appearance on <u>WGN radio</u> for updates on Coronavirus and also the primary care physician workforce shortage.



Heartland Alliance, a Safe Haven, and Rush University Medical Center: Steven Rothschild, MD worked to partner with Heartland Alliance to provide a safe shelter for homeless to recover from COVID-19 at Safe Haven. Their announcement was covered by WBEZ.
